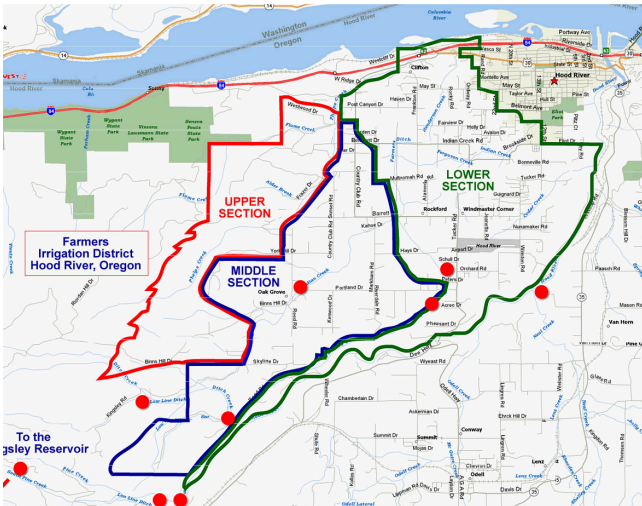



FID was established in 1874, with its modern service area set when two smaller districts combined in 1978.

FID uses many water sources and delivery routes to serve lands at different elevations. These lands are generally divided into Upper Section (highest elevation), Middle Section, and Lower Section (lowest elevation).

As a result of different water sources and delivery routes, customers may see variations in water quality, delivery pressures, and dependability.

FID KEY FACTS

- Irrigation season is set by state law as April 15 - September 30.
- FID provides untreated river water for irrigation. Irrigation water may only be used to grow plants and may not be used for other outdoor or indoor uses.
- Water rights have specific places of use (generally a specific area on your property).
- Maximum flow rate = 5.61 gallons per minute x water right acres.
- FID strives to deliver pressures between 35 and 55 psi.
- If you have low pressure, try cleaning/scrubbing your filter screen.
- Irrigation bills are mailed in early November for the following irrigation season and are due in full by April 15th.
- FID has a person on-call 24 hours a day for emergency response.

FID delivers water to the high point of the quarter-quarter (a 40-acre block). After FID's delivery point, the delivery system becomes private. Many private delivery systems are shared between multiple FID customers.

New customers are often curious about where and how FID water enters their property. Unfortunately, there is no standard answer. If possible, it is best to gather information about the property's irrigation system from the prior owner.

Your neighbors may be able to provide information about the system as well, especially if it is a part of a shared private delivery system.
